Our international and multi-professional faculty has extensive experience in instructor training, human factors, patient safety and CRM. The course is based on sound learning goals, relevant topics and provides hands-on practice and reflection. The course addresses experienced simulator instructors who want to develop their skill in running simulation courses that help participants reflect on their actions. Participants work in small groups in a highly stimulating learning environment. The course language is English, requiring a level that allows taking part in discussions and reflections. The course duration is 3 days apart from preparation.
